There are **no formal test questions** for this course.

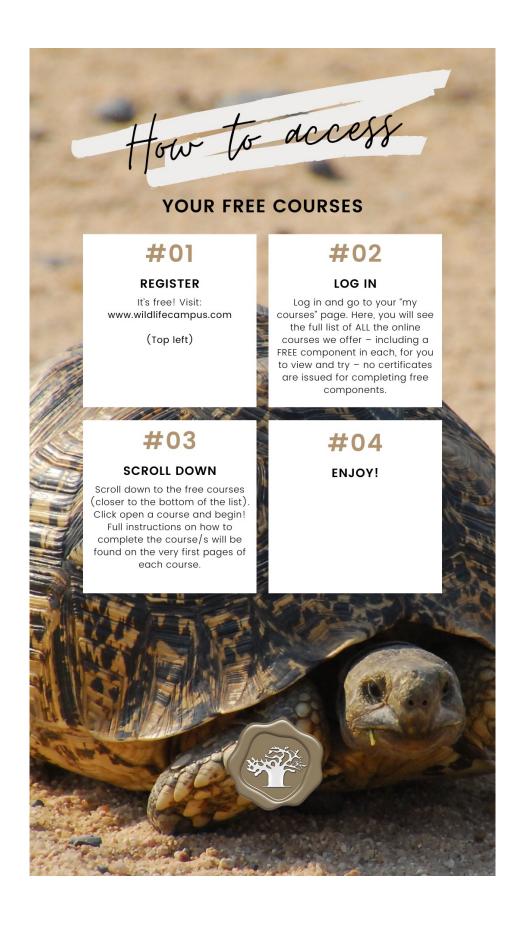


Average 1-3 weeks. There are no deadlines; you may complete courses at your own pace.
